BRANCH CAMPUSES

A branch campus is geographically apart and independent of the main campus of the institution. The location is independent if the location offers courses in educational programs leading to a degree, certificate, or recognized educational credential; has its own faculty and administrative or supervisory organization; and has its own budgetary and hiring authority. **All branch campuses must be visited.**

ACTIVE ADDITIONAL LOCATIONS

An active additional location is a location, other than a branch campus, that is geographically apart from the main campus and at which the institution offers at least 50 percent of an educational program. If the institution has more than three active additional locations, at least one-third of the institution's additional locations must be visited.
